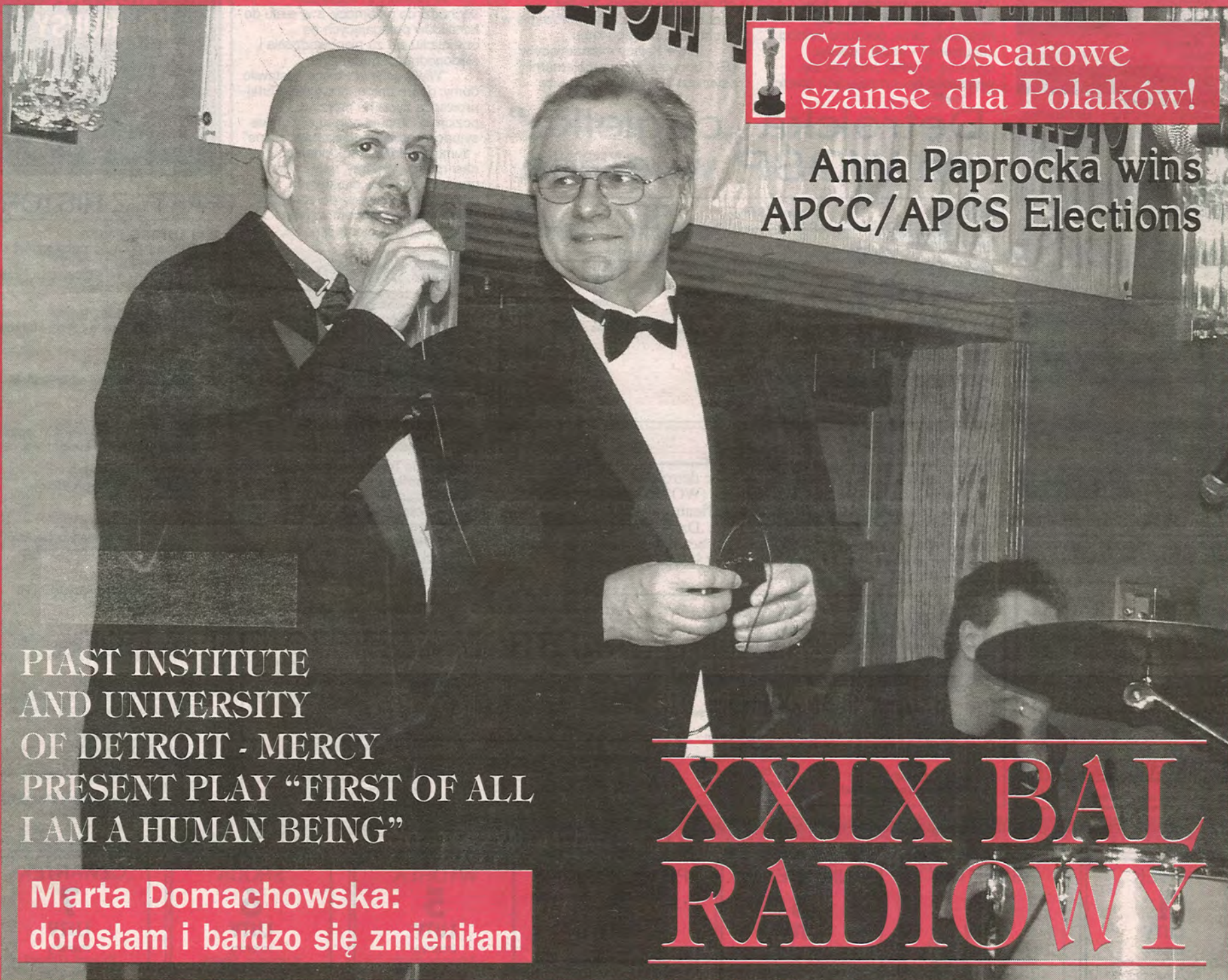

HAMTRAMCK, MI - The Piast Institute and the University of Detroit - Mercy drama department announce a matinee performance of the play "I Am First A Human Being" based on the prison letters of Krystyna Wituska adapted for the stage by Irene Tomaszewski. The play will be presented at 2:00 pm on Saturday February 16 at the Marygrove College Theater located in the Liberal Arts Building on the Marygrove campus at 8425 West McNichols. A lighthearted, even frivolous, young woman matures into a serious and determined woman ready to sacrifice her life for her country and for her ideals of human brotherhood. Krystyna Wituska emerges as a heroine not only for her time but for ours. The play is suitable for middle school and high school students.

The play will be produced by Yolanda Fleischer and directed by Courtney Burkett. Krystyna Wituska will be played by Marissa Thorndyke. All facilities and production costs will be provided by the drama department of the University of Detroit - Mercy.
