
PIAST INSTITUTE'S NEW PROGRAM: "OPENING DOORS TO BETTER HEALTH" FOR THE POLISH POPULATION

Are you pregnant and have no medical coverage for yourself and your unborn child?

Are your children in need of dental or medical care but you have no insurance?

Are you an immigrant? Are you having trouble with your green card or visa? Have you been injured in an accident or hurt at work?

In all cases, you may be eligible for Medicaid coverage.

In cooperation with the Medicaid program, the Piast Institute is administering a special outreach program to assist the Polish and Polish American population of Hamtramck and the Detroit area to get health care coverage. The program is aimed at improving the health and well-being of our people who do not have insurance or cannot afford health, dental or prenatal care.

It is focused especially on the welfare of children, youth, pregnant women and the elderly not covered by insurance or Medicare. Newborns and children of immigrant parents and pregnant women who are not citizens are eligible for care. Prenatal care is covered. Emergency care and pregnancy coverage is available to all without regard to status. The aim of the program is to promote a healthy population and avoid costly hospital expenses.

The program does not require long and often frustrating visits to a social service agency. Persons can easily apply in comfortable private surroundings at the Piast Institute.

Language assistance can be provided for those who speak mainly Polish.
